Milwaukie Public Safety Foundation supports the Milwaukie Police Department K9 program by purchasing trained police dogs for the department, as required.

Since 2008 we have purchased 4 dogs for the department at an approximate cost of \$13,000 each, the last one being Benz in November 2021.

The main fund raising event is an annual 9K for K9 Walk, which is being restarted in August 2022, after a 2 year break during the COVID pandemic.

Who will be involved in the project or program and how has support evolved in the neighborhood/s?

The event is organized and run by the Milwaukie Public Safety Foundation. A 501(c)(3) registered in the State of Oregon. It is sponsored by local businesses and individuals from the City of Milwaukie and surrounding areas. Those taking part in the event mainly come from the same area. This year subject to permit approval we plan to hold the Walk downtown along the waterfront. The Walk is not a race but a fun family event to raise funds for and to support Milwaukie Police Department. The Walk receives practical support from the Milwaukie Community Response Team.

Project Time Frame: Beginning Date 1/3/22 End Date 8/27/22

Grant money will be used to fund the organization costs and running of the Walk. 100% of grants, sponsorship, donations or Walk entry fees will only be used to run the Walk and support the MPD K9 program. Costs include but not limited too, insurance, rental fees charged by property owners, event t-shirts, permit fees, and refreshments.
