Concert in the Park subcommittee notes

Because the bulk of money for concerts comes from the annual grant the NDA receives from the city, the Concert committee recommends that there is an annual cap of \$1,000.00 dedicated to grant requests and allocations. Additionally, the committee recommends a \$250 cap per grant. The NDA will have to be thoughtful about grant awards as there are typically 6 or 7 repeat grant requests annually.

Even with these parameters, there will still be a funding shortfall for concerts going into the future. The committee perused the alternative funding ideas that Stephan had put together and came up with some additional ideas. After discussing all of the options, the following are the options we would like to suggest the NDA moves forward with.

- 1 File grants with all NDA's, with the exception of the Ardenwald NDA as they provide a concert series in August as well.
- 2 Seek financial support from the City of Milwaukie for concerts.
- 3 Assure that grants awarded by our NDA do not diminish funding for concerts beyond a predetermined level. (See first paragraph)
- 4 Apply for a grant from Celebrate Milwaukie Inc. (CMI).
- 5 Sell drinks at the concerts (Lisa has since found out that Hearth & Soul Pizza sells drinks. Maybe we sell popsicles?)
- 6 Have a raffle at the concerts.
- 7 Apply for a grant from Providence

Lisa agreed to apply for the grant from CMI. She also agreed to sell popsicles at the NDA tent. However, she is hoping NDA members step

up and take turns in the tent at some of the concerts so that she can enjoy some of them with her family.

Help is needed with all of the other funding ideas.
