

The 9 PM Routine



The #9PMRoutine is a public safety initiative that encourages community members to take steps to secure their homes and vehicles each evening at 9 p.m. The goal is to reduce the risk of crime and make it harder for criminals to commit crimes of opportunity.

The Milwaukie Police Department encourages these steps as part of the 9 PM Routine:

- Lock doors and windows: Make sure all doors and windows are locked to prevent unauthorized entry.
- Secure valuables: Remove valuables from cars and lock them. Don't leave valuables visible through the windows.
- Turn on outdoor lights: Turn on porch lights, pathway lights or other outdoor lighting to deter potential intruders.
- Activate security systems: Make sure any alarm systems or security cameras are activated.
- Close the garage: If you have a garage, close it before bedtime.
- Check on loved ones: Ensure family members are safe and accounted for.

Community Events Fund Supports Fall Activities

When the city's Equity Steering Committee met to review the first applications for the Milwaukie Community Events Fund, they were faced with tough choices. Applicants submitted proposals for eight different events around Milwaukie, and the committee members had to weigh many factors, including the applicants' ability to produce the events, how well the events promoted diversity, equity and inclusion, and the overall benefits to the community.

Ultimately, two events were chosen—a discussion series, entitled Own Voices, hosted by Spoke & Word Books (spokeandwordbooks.com, 10863 SE Main St) and a Dia de los Muertos celebration hosted by Vida 33 Latin Bistro (facebook.com/Vida33bistro, 10600 SE McLoughlin Blvd).

The Own Voices discussion series will be held during three evenings in October and November, and will feature Disability Visibility by Alice Wong, The Undocumented Americans by Cornejo Villavicencio, and David G. Lewis' Tribal Histories of the Willamette Valley. These works will be explored in guided discussions led by senior members of Spoke & Word staff. 20 copies of each book will be provided at no cost to interested participants.

Vida 33's Dia de los Muertos celebration is planned for Nov. 1 and 2. The event will include traditional aspects of the holiday drawn from Mexico, Peru and the United States, and feature free food, decorations and entertainment. The event is intended to promote cultural understanding through an immersive experience.

Stanley Reservoir Project

In October, the city will begin maintenance on the Stanley Reservoir located in Stanley Park. The project will bring the 46-year-old reservoir up to current standards. improve water quality and make it earthquake ready. As part of the project, the water reservoir will receive:



- Structural repairs
- Seismic fittings to prevent damage during earthquakes
- Additional safety equipment for maintenance staff
- Removal of a primer paint coating that contains lead
- New protective paint coatings and mixer for improved water quality

What to Expect

- Daytime work hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- · Noise, dust and equipment on site
- Heaters and dehumidifiers running day and night (approved by a noise variance) to allow the paint to adhere to the inside of the reservoir more effectively
- Stanley Park remaining open
