Basketball is right around the corner and we are anxiously getting ready for our 2022-2023 Summer/Fall/Winter Mustang basketball season. Our program focuses on building a solid foundation for student-athletes interested in basketball. We believe in building character first and athletic skills second. One of our goals is to enable young men to become positive members in the community through the experiences gained in basketball. This year-round program includes the high school basketball season, summer leagues, fitness and conditioning classes, and academic support.

The Mustang basketball program is increasing in the number of players at the high school and in our youth feeder program so are our needs for equipment, uniforms, facility improvements and staff. Again this year, our budget from the district has been reduced and so much of our income comes through fundraising. To run a successful basketball program it takes a budget of right around \$20,000 annually.

Here is where we desperately need assistance. We understand that the economy isn't the strongest right now, but we believe our community and families are stronger. Our needs are not always financial. We are in need of partners who will go that extra mile with us to see success in these young men. We need to provide our student-athletes with a facility, uniforms, and equipment that demonstrate our commitment to them. Listed below are a few of our more urgent ones: new basketball's, nets and rims, basketball equipment such as shooting tools, rebounding tools and conditioning tools, uniforms (currently, each team barely has one set for both home/away contests) summer league sponsorship, summer tournaments and team camps, coaching stipends, gym maintenance, and meals for our players, travel expenses, lodging, transportation, and travel money. You would be helping 50 kids in our basketball program.

We believe that Milwaukie High Basketball is an excellent organization to choose to support. The MHS coaching staff stress having fun, developing not only basketball, but also life skills. We also stress a commitment to bettering their community through their behaviors and service activities. Since 2008 we have purchased 4 dogs for the department at an approximate cost of \$13,000 each, the last one being Benz in November 2021.			
The main fund raising event is an annual 9K for K9 Walk, which is being restarted in August 2022, after a 2 year break during the COVID pandemic.
