NCPRD Updates (Heather K):

- New planner has been onboarded and will be helping some of park projects, another hire is in progress to better staff NCPRD
- Beginning budget for next fiscal year (2023)
- Latino cultural event (Fiesta Latina en el Parque) was successful, looking at other community-culture events
- New campaign: Pocket Talk
- Pool shutdown in September is coming to an end; Opening Oct 1
- Aug 13 event at Milwaukie Bay park – Concert and Duck Race, with partners Milwaukie Parks Foundation and North Clackamas Watersheds Council

City Updates (Natalie R):

- Stormwater outreach reminders for appropriate water disposal which may impact parks (Furnberg park was recently impacted)
 - When pools are needing to be drained follow City rules including off-gassing pools (specifically for chlorinated pools) to mitigate stormwater impacts

- Friends of Trees event at 9am -volunteers welcome day of or early (\$35 per tree; sign up for Oct 5)

Councilor Kathy Hyzy City Update – Parks Management

- City's engagement with NCPRD
- Kathy gave a presentation on "The Future of Milwaukie City Parks", discussing the background of the City exploring leaving the parks district
- Added new goal (on top of climate and equity) on improving Milwaukie's park system and services
- Park relationship to 40% canopy coverage and improving open space
- City will be looking for community feedback on parks management
- Timeline is still in progress; City is going to each neighborhood districts (Oct), PTA's and town hall meeting (tentatively Nov)
- If there are community groups to include in this process, please let city staff know
- City has heard suggestions from Happy Valley about process; City of Milwaukie owns parks properties so it is a different scenario than Happy Valley leaving NCPRD
- City website will have more information on the parks management discussion
- Reach out to Michael Bork from NCPRD or board of Clackamas County commissioners to provide input and feedback and ask questions from NCPRD

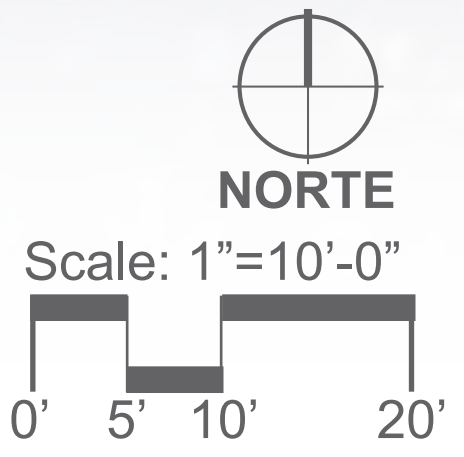
